- Sponsor: North American Colleges and Teachers of Agriculture (NACTA)
- Held at campus locations each April (Texas Tech Univ. April 3-5, 2013)
- Crops contest is one of 6-10 total

Kansas State's Involvement

- Over 20 year history of participation
- Senior students try out for the team
- Practice 4-6 hours/week spring term
- Credit course available if desired
- CCA exam taken following contest
